

PUBLIC PERFORMANCES AND EXHIBITIONS

While the Board encourages the presentation of performances and exhibitions displaying the talents and accomplishments of Kittatinny pupils, it directs both building and district administration to consider carefully the effects on instructional time of any such proposed activity.

The principal and directors of activities shall:

- A. Maintain high standards of performance and conduct in all programs selected;
- B. Review all program materials and offerings in advance of scheduling to determine sound educational value;
- C. Consult with the superintendent (and through the superintendent, the Board) on possible controversial presentations;
- D. Make an effort to increase pupil involvement in planning.

When a pupil performance is requested by an organization not connected with the schools, the organization shall pay all expenses. Criteria to be used in determining whether such requests shall be granted are those expressed in policy #1320, Relations between Public and Pupils.
